Dr. J.C. Walker bought Boxer^e out of China in 1896 and presented him to Pacific as a "mascot." He is everybody's^{y's} "good fortune." Dr. and Mrs. Hall were medical missionaries in China at the time of the Boxer rebellion and were on ~~XXXXX~~^{their} way home in 1898. Dorothy Hall '20 was born in Shanghai.

Dorothy and her 13 year old sister Esther roomed next door to me at Herrick Hall, in 1916 through 1918 while their parents went back to China.

I became very close to the whole family and Mrs. Hall gave me a piece of embroidery from a Mandarin coat for a wedding present. I had a tray made with a frame so it can be hung like a picture. Would you like this tray for the college museum?
