Vista House at Crown Point was designated as a National Natural Landmark in 1971 and was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1974. Unfortunately, this structure was, in 1995, temporarily closed to the public after investigations disclosed safety concerns as a result of moisture intrusion.

Vista House has significant historical value that is enjoyed by over 850,000 visitors each year. We believe it is in the best interest of all Oregonians to preserve this historic structure for future generations.

Damage assessments have been completed and thanks to generous donors and successful grant submittal, restorations have begun.

We are in the process of submitting a grant application and would appreciate a **letter of support** from your organization. 


