



Most classes are kept small, contributing to friendly personal contact between student and teacher.




Library reading rooms offer a quiet retreat in which to read or study.


The campus newspaper and year-book are directed by students with assistance from the Department of Journalism.




A nurse is always on duty in the campus infirmary.

BOXER, as a symbol of campus esprit de corps, has a meaning far deeper than can be seen by viewing his much patched exterior. The name of this bronze Chinese unicorn derives from his presentation to the University by a missionary who fled the Boxer Rebellion in China. He remains hidden most of the time, being shown only briefly and without warning at a campus event such as an assembly or football game. When Boxer is "flashed," there is a scramble to gain possession and whisk him into hiding until the next "Boxer Flash."
