JAMES STEWART, COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH OFFICER, & HIS STAFF HAVE VISITED ~~THE~~ OUR AREA COUNCILS AND DISCUSSED HEALTH PROGRAMS WITH THE LOCAL PEOPLE. AS A RESULT OF THESE MEETINGS DR. STEWART ~~HAS COME UP WITH A PLAN~~ <sup>decided</sup> ~~FOR~~ <sup>TO</sup> HOLD ~~WELL-BABY~~ <sup>WELL-BABY</sup> & IMMUNIZATION CLINICS IN ~~THE~~ <sup>EACH</sup> ~~OF THE~~ CENTERS ~~ON A REGULAR BASIS~~ <sup>regularly</sup>. A CLINIC WILL BE HELD IN EACH CENTER EVERY OTHER MONTH WITH EVERY SECOND CLINIC BEING A WELL-BABY CLINIC. DR. STEWART HAS SECURED THE SERVICES OF A PEDIATRICIAN FROM THE OREGON MEDICAL SCHOOL FOR THE WELL CHILD CLINICS, & SHE WILL EXAMINE THE BABIES ON A REGULAR BASIS. THIS WILL GIVE THE PARENTS & THE DOCTOR <sup>an opportunity</sup> THE CHANCE TO GET TO KNOW EACH OTHER <sup>acquainted</sup>.

~~Our~~ <sup>recent</sup> ~~TWO~~ ~~LAST~~ CLINICS WERE HELD IN NORTH PLAINS & TIMBER ON FEBRUARY 29, & MARCH 7, RESPECTIVELY. BOTH WERE IMMUNIZATION CLINICS. THE NORTH PLAINS CLINIC REACHED 48 PEOPLE, 42 OF WHOM WERE PRE-SCHOOLERS OF LOW INCOME FAMILIES. THE TIMBER CLINIC TOOK CARE OF 35 BABIES & PRE-SCHOOLERS.
