WEATHERIZATION DAY

As proclaimed by the US Department of Energy, October 30th is National Weatherization Day.

All Oregonians deserve the opportunity to live in homes that are safe, healthy, energy efficient and comfortable.

Community Action's Energy Conservation Program weatherizes more than 230 homes each year, saving each household about \$340 per year on their energy bill. These are permanent savings that families can spend on food, medicine, clothes, paying utility bills, etc.

Weatherized homes reduce the total energy demand which lowers utility rates for all Oregonians.

Community Action's Energy Conservation Program assists families working towards self-sufficiency and also contributes to the entire community by eliminating carbon and particulate emissions, reducing dependency on foreign oil, stimulating local economies, creating jobs and stabilizing neighborhoods.

COMMUNITY ACTION

Community Action was formed in 1965 as a small grassroots organization committed to eliminating conditions of poverty and creating opportunities for people and communities to thrive.

Today, Community Action is one of the largest private nonprofit social service organizations serving low-income families in Washington County and an essential partner in the local safety net.
