




After description and before signatures is, in part: "A bond by which grantors are bound in the sum of \$30,000.00 conditioned that if the grantors, their heirs etc., shall by a good and sufficient deed of confirmation confirm and assure above premises to grantees or their assigns when they (Grantors) shall obtain a Patent from the United States Government and shall in the meantime do all that is needful and requisite to obtain a donation of the same, then this obligation to be void, otherwise to remain of full force and virtue." Plat of ForestGrove, with addition on T. G. Naylors Claim surveyed for the trustees of P. U. and vT. A. the town of Forest Grove, in the County of Washington and State of Oregon.

Commencing at the northwest corner of Rev. H. Clarks claim buried for the corner in the place of the original stake, one pint bottle a quantity of glass, and a rock, the point commencing near the surface of the grounad together with a cedar stake, bearing trees cut fown one stump remaining, 30 inches in diameter, south 11 deg west 68 1ks. distance and is exact with the government surveys (Vari. 182 deg east) and running thence east 20.64 chains; (toward s the center fo the Academy Hall) setting stake and planting a rock at the point where the original survey of said town by I Mitchell bagan; thence follow ng field notes of Academy of College Block 6.10 chains north and 33 feet east set stake; thence east 13.20 chains stake; thence south (at 6.10 chanins Harvey Clarkes north line) 12.70 chains southeast corner ofC. Field notes of the Addition on T. G. Naylor Land Claim

Commencing at the northeast deorner of said Naylor Claim and running south on the line between him and E. walkers and Harvey Clarkes 30 chains and 2 links and from this base proceeding to lay off a stre-t 66 feet wide; thence a tier of Blocks 6.10 chains square, except the north No 5 which is in fractional lots, only being 1.31 chains north and south with streets intersecting, and corresponding with Main Street, in Forest Grove, are 66 feet wide except at the south of Flock No 14, being 31 links to the south boundary. Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, full 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 fractional the western tier being 5.70 chains only from east to west, divided in the middle makin all of the lots in the tier fractional the stakes not set on the field in the middle and west line of the west tier except at the extreme northwest and southwest corners.

DESCRIPTION

Lots 1 and 4 in Block 4 in the City of Forest Grove: "Provided always that these presents are upon the express condition that if at any time the said party of the second part his heirs, assigns, shall keep on the above described and conveyed premises, for sale, exchange or to give away ardent spirits to be used as a beverage, or shall allow gaming on the said premises, then these presents shall become null and void, and the said Predident and Trustees, shall have good right and full authority to reenter upon said premises, have hold use, occupy and enjoy the same just as if this deed had never been executed.

Remarks: Deed is signed by Harvey Clark President, Sealed with Corporate Seal.
