


OREGON'S FIFTY-FOURTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY 1967

Oregon's Fifty-Fourth Legislative Assembly convened at the State Capitol in Salem on January 9, 1967. However, in accordance with a practice started during the 1965 session, several committees began their activities prior to the formal opening of the Assembly. Since the close of the 1965 session there has been a great amount of interim committee activity, and one of the important questions facing the 1967 Assembly will be the con-

sideration of annual legislative assemblies. As usual, opening day ceremonies included swearing in of Senators, Representatives, President of the Senate, and Speaker of the House. It also included the swearing in of a newly-elected Governor, Tom Lawson McCall; a new Secretary of State, appointed by Governor McCall; and, for the first time in the State's history, a farewell address by a two-term governor, Mark O. Hatfield.


SENATE

Senator E. D. Potts, Democrat from Grants Pass, was elected President of the Senate for this session which is composed of eleven Republicans and nineteen Democrats. Daniel A. Thiel, Democrat from Astoria, was elected President Pro Tempore.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

F. F. Montgomery, Republican from Eugene, was elected to serve his second term as Speaker of the House of Representatives. Joe Rogers, Re-publican from Independence, was elected Speaker Pro Tempore. Membership of the house for the 1967 session is composed of twenty-two Democrats and thirty-eight Republicans.







COMMITTEES

Much of the effectiveness of any given session of the Oregon Legislature is dependent upon committee appointments, for it is in committee that much of the work is done. There are thirty-seven standing committees with some regularly scheduled meetings for practically all hours of the day except when the Senate and House of Representatives are convened. Occasionally, when bills of great public interest are being considered, special evening meetings are held in large hearing rooms which are often filled to overflowing.


