

Dayton May 3^d 1872

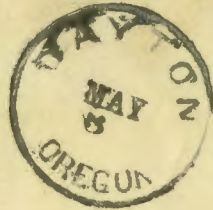
Dear Father

I know you are
anxiously waiting to hear from me
I have been to see Hall, and found
he could do nothing at present
He still insists that he has money
coming, I have strong hopes he
will be able to raise enough to
pay Larocque Saverebo's note by
the time it becomes due, I wrote to
them yesterday and have just
received an answer from them by
Bood, I asked for no particular
time, as I knew not how long
to ask for. I supposed that if
they gave any time at all it would
be until harvest, as they would
then need the money as a matter
of course. I believe the note was

made payable in Oregon City
and being over 500.00 would have
to lay over until Circuit Court
which is held in Clackamas
4th Monday in Oct. All they
could do would be to give us
notice and make additional
expense. I however believe the
matter will be settled without
any trouble. I cannot doubt but
what Providence will order all
for the best, I am not doing much
at Insurance. Find a great many
who would gladly insure but
have not the means. If farmers
are successful this year in crops
and prices, there is a good prospect
that it will do well this fall
I am to see Hall tomorrow and
see what he can probably do I have
written to Patton to see how
he stands there, and whether
the prices he has are in his

own name &c. This affair
of Larocque worries me more than
any thing else, as my other creditors
cant expect any thing until I get
my pay. Perhaps you had better
write to them. I enclose this
letter. Love to all
