A

Authorizes districts operating community colleges to admit qualified high school and resident and nonresident students and establish tuition and fee schedules for resident and nonresident students. Authorizes operating districts and nonoperating districts to contract for tuition payments for high school and nonresident students. Adjusts reimbursement provisions to reflect differences in tuition. Amends ORS 341.610. Repeals sec. 334,335, c. 100, OL 1965, and enacts in lieu. (S 42)

Requires use of poll books in area education district elections. Amends ORS 341.770. (H 1725)

_____ , districts, formation
petition dismissal c.238

A

Authorizes State Board of Education to dismiss petition for formation of area education district if not warranted under policies in SJR 5 (1965). Allows appeal from dismissal. Adds to ORS 341.710 to 341.780. Eff. 21 Apr 65. (S 170)

organizational expenses

Authorizes election on formation of area education district to include question of incurring up to \$5,000 indebtedness to pay organizational expenses. Permits expenditure of amount approved without budgeting. Requires repayment under first budget. Adds to ORS 341.710 to 341.800. Eff. 1 Apr 65. (S 320)

_____, establishment by **A** c.198
school districts

Terminates authority of common school districts to form community colleges. Permits such districts already operating colleges to continue operation and receive state financial aid until area education district formed and establishes community college in area. Repeals ORS 341.540, 341.550, and sec. 339, c.100, OL 1965. (S 33)

_____, federal funds **A** c.102

Authorizes Secretary of State to advance payments of federal funds for vocational training to area education districts. Amends ORS 344.070. (S 7)

_____, financial aid **Excused** c.487

Authorizes distribution of federal funds to community colleges separately from state funds. Removes priority system in allocating state aid to colleges established prior to 1963. Amends ORS 341.610. (S 34)

_____, names **A** c.19

Requires official name of community college to include words "community college". Applies to established community colleges by July 1, 1966. (S 40)

_____, policy statement **A** SJR 5

Declares legislative statement of policy regarding orderly development of community college program to guide Department of Education and governing boards and administrators of community colleges. Instructs State Board of Education to present to next legislature a long-range, community college development program and data on construction and operating costs of community colleges.

_____, scholarships **A** c.148

Authorizes tuition and fee-exempting scholarships at community colleges to be granted by operating district. (S 32)

_____, vocational course **A** c.236
contracts

Authorizes community colleges to contract with private vocational schools to provide vocational classes or course work under certain conditions. Declares costs of such contracts to be operating expenses. (S 17)

Disadvantaged children, **A** c.531
special programs

Authorizes school districts to establish special programs for disadvantaged children. Establishes partial state reimbursement, payable in advance, for pilot programs in 1965-66. Appropriates \$100,000. Sets maximum of \$5 million on expenditures from federal funds. Eff. 1 Jul 65. (H 1307)

Driver training courses, state **Excused** c.549
reimbursement

Fixes state reimbursement to school districts when tuition charged at difference between approved cost and tuition or \$50, whichever is less. Amends ORS 343.730. Eff. 1 Jul 65. (H 1814)

Educational Coordinating **A** c.496
Council

Establishes Educational Coordinating Council, to advise Governor on, coordinate and study, educational functions such as educational television, community colleges, teacher preparation and certification and other areas. Transfers to council duties of commission which handled federal funds for construction. Requires reports to legislature. Appropriates money. Amends ORS 351.270. Eff. 22 May 65. (S 174)

Employes, annuities, **ABSENT** c.606
tax-deferred

Permits public education employe to authorize employer to forward portion of salary, together with matching funds by employer, to company under tax-deferred annuity contract benefiting employe. Eff. 1 Jan 66. (H 1671)

_____, attendance supervisors **A** c.136

Deletes special qualifications for attendance supervisors. Repeals ORS 339.050. (H 1024)

_____, health insurance **A** c.254

Authorizes district school boards to enter into medical and health service contracts to provide benefits for employes, and to pay none, part or all of premiums. (H 1490)

_____, retirement, **Excused** c.297
higher education

Authorizes higher education academic employes to elect participation in retirement benefits program under contracts with life insurance or annuity companies, in addition to mandatory coverage under Public Employes' Retirement System. Requires employe contributions under additional program on annual salary over \$4,800 and matching employer contributions, with employer contributions for first five years of employe coverage under Public Employes' Retirement System to be held in Public Employes' Retirement Fund and then paid to life insurance or annuity company. Additional program first operative 1 Jan 66. Adds to ORS chapter 237. (H 1247)

_____, sick leave **A** c.183

Increases permissible accumulation of sick leave for school employes from 70 to 100 days. Authorizes leave without pay. Amends ORS 342.596. (H 1410)

_____, teachers, certificates **A** c.550

Eliminates professional teaching and educational specialty certificates. Authorizes State Board of Education to establish additional categories. Establishes fees for evaluation and first certificate. Prohibits additional educational requirements for renewal of certificate to teach in kindergarten through grade eight. Authorizes secondary school teachers to teach in field of college major or meet state board requirements. Extends pre-1961 certification law to October 15, 1965. Amends and repeals sections in ORS chapter 342. (H 1815)

procedure, validation

Authorizes school districts with 100,000 or more population to

Clarifies procedure for registering teaching certificates and contracts and reporting thereon, and makes such procedure inapplicable to health certificates. Amends ORS 342.600. (H 1010)

_____, teachers, retirement, **A** c.263
death benefits

Requires additional death benefit under teachers' retirement system (Multnomah County School District No. 1) to be paid to estate of deceased teacher if beneficiaries named in statute do not survive teacher, instead of limiting payment to beneficiaries so named. Amends ORS 239.260. (S 177)

_____, teachers, retirement, **A** c.520
dividend payments to

Revises procedure for determining and paying to retired teachers, under teachers' retirement system (Multnomah County School District No. 1), dividends from excess interest on investments, gearing procedure to that for dividends to retired employes under Public Employes' Retirement System. Amends ORS 239.205, 239.258. Eff. 1 Jul 65. (S 415)

_____, teachers, tenure **A** c.608

Establishes new teacher tenure law for school districts with more than 4,500 average daily membership. Creates 33-member Professional Review Committee to review dismissal. Abolishes Teacher Tenure Commission. Amends and repeals sections in ORS chapter 342. (H 1772)

Students, referrals for diagnosis of mental deficiency (cont.)

referral of school-age children to diagnostic facilities of institutions for mentally deficient. Amends ORS 343.490. (H 1375)

Superintendent, county school, election A c.137

Deletes provisions for election of county school superintendent. Repeals sections in ORS chapter 252. (H 1083)

Superintendent of Public Instruction, selection A c.519

Provides that State Board of Education appoint Superintendent of Public Instruction, and any nomination to office made at 1966 primary without effect, if constitutional requirement for election repealed at 1966 primary election. Establishes procedures for election of superintendent, to be repealed if constitutional requirement not repealed. Amends sec. 6, c. 100, OL 1965. Repeals sections in ORS chapters 252, 326. (S 414)

Teacher Standards and Practices Commission A/S.P. c.535

Establishes 16-member Teacher Standards and Practices Commission, appointed by State Board of Education from panels nominated by teachers and administrators, by private college organization and by State Board of Higher Education. Authorizes commission to study standards, make recommendations to state board, and investigate complaints against teachers at request of teacher or Superintendent of Public Instruction. Adds to factors state board to consider in establishing teacher certification rules. Provides \$3 fee, collectible when teaching certificates issued or renewed, which is appropriated for expenses of commission. Abolishes Certification Review Committee. Amends ORS 342.165 and sec. 363, c.100, OL 1965. Repeals ORS 342.170. Eff. 1 Jul 65. (H 1434)

Vocational education, Federal Manpower Development and Training Act c.612 A

Establishes vocational and technical training program under Federal Manpower Development and Training Act. Authorizes Department of Employment to refer, through Department of Education, eligible persons for training available through public educational agencies

Vocational education, Federal Manpower Development and Training Act (cont.)

and institutions and through private agencies and employers. Eff. 1 Jul 65. (H 1105)

Vocational schools, advisory committee on standards c.529 A

Establishes seven-member advisory committee to conduct studies and make recommendations on vocational schools and advise State Board of Education on standards, which board may adopt, revise or refuse. Authorizes certificates of compliance to vocational schools that meet standards. Authorizes community colleges to give credit for approved courses taken at vocational schools. Appropriates \$30,000 for 1965-67 biennium. Amends ORS 345.010, 345.015, 345.220. (H 1099)

, tuition and training contracts c.409 A

Requires tuition and training contracts between student and vocational school to contain schedule for refunds when courses not completed. Prohibits suits by school on contracts not containing such schedule. Authorizes Superintendent of Public Instruction to suspend or revoke license of school entering into contracts without refund schedule. Adds to ORS chapter 345. Amends ORS 345.120. (H 1100)

teachers, termination of contracts c.163 A

Changes grounds for teacher contract termination to 20 days' absence for sickness or other causes immediately after exhaustion of accumulated sick leave. Amends ORS 342.640. (S 31)

Funds, Basic School Support, appropriation c.528 A

Increases Basic School Support Fund appropriation from \$152 per child to \$160 for fiscal years after 1965-66. Amends ORS 327.014. Eff. 1 Jul 65. (H 1095)

Basic School Support, filing audit statements c.199 A

Requires all common and union high school districts to file audit statements with Department of Education within six months after end of fiscal year audited. Authorizes exclusion of districts failing to comply from distribution of state equalization apportionment from Basic School Support Fund. (S 37)

Basic School Support, transportation allocation c.323 A

Establishes account in Basic School Support Fund equal to 60 percent of school district approved cost for transportation expended two years prior to apportionment, to be apportioned to districts pro rata on basis of such costs. Amends ORS 327.035. Eff. 4 May 65. (S 38)

Common School, loans, property appraisals c.229 A

Deletes prohibition against including perishable improvements on farm property in appraisal for loan. Authorizes Land Board to charge loan applicants appraisal fees. Amends ORS 327.430, 327.435. (H 1560)

Common School, student loans c.532 A

Authorizes Land Board to make certain loans from Common School Fund to eligible post-high school students. Provides repayment plan. Appropriates \$100,000 to guaranty fund to protect Common School Fund from loss through unrepaid loans. Prohibits loans if guaranty fund falls below four percent of outstanding loans. Authorizes State Treasurer to invest guaranty fund.

Amends ORS 327.425, 327.430, 327.440, 327.445. Eff. 1 Jul 65. (H 1366)

county school c.491 A

Requires county governing body to provide, by tax levy or otherwise, county school fund equal to lesser of amount levied in 1965-66 or \$10 per child ages 4 to 20 in preceding school census. Amends ORS 328.005. (S 85)

Law, topical revision c.100 A

Revises, in form but not substance, ORS chapters 326, 327, 328, 330, 331, 332, 334, 336, 337, 338, 339, 341 and parts of ORS chapters 310, 333, 335, 342, 343, 344, 346, 352, 354. Repeals all criminal penalties. Eff. 25 Mar 65. (H 1020)

Radiation Center, matching Funds HJR 55 A

Authorizes \$387,840 to be made available to State Board of Higher Education to match federal grants for construction of nuclear reactor addition to Radiation Center at Oregon State University. Limits expenditures to \$901,840.

Scholarships, teachers of mentally retarded c.237 A

Alters requirements of eligibility for scholarships for teachers of mentally retarded. Makes scholarships renewable under certain conditions. Amends ORS 343.552, 343.554, 343.556, 343.558. (S 36)

School districts, administrative, amending plan c.101 A

Authorizes voters of administrative school district to amend reorganization plan under which district established. (S 6)

administrative, formation c.261 A

Authorizes submission to voters as one question a plan to create more than one administrative school district, to be voted on in single election. Amends sections in ORS chapter 330. (S 35)

administrative, merger c.275 A

Authorizes merger of administrative school districts into county school districts. Amends ORS 330.300. (S 231)

School districts (cont.)

bonds c.315 A

Eliminates requirement that school district refunding bonds constitute charge upon same character of revenues or other assets as bonds refunded. Amends ORS 328.280. (H 1742)

boundary changes, effective date c.244 A

Specifies effective date of school district boundary changes as not earlier than period allowed for remonstrance nor later than following May 31. Amends sec. 76, c. 100, OL 1965. (H 1023)

boundary changes, reorganization plans c.621 A

Fixes time for district boundary board to complete action on school district boundary change petition. Permits State Board of Education to act if district boundary board fails to act. Deletes special procedure for boundary change upon petition by all resident taxpayers and voters. Fixes time for reorganization committee to complete action on plan involving joint school district and provides for appointment of arbitration board. Adds to ORS 330.090 to 330.100, 330.505 to 330.780. Amends sec. 76, c. 100, OL 1965. Eff. 3 Jun 65. (H 1599)

county high schools, discontinuance c.239 A

Provides that county high school district completely within single school district ceases to exist. Amends ORS 335.735. (S 237)

directors, recall c.172 A

Revises procedure for recall of school board directors. Amends ORS 335.750. Repeals ORS 331.420, 331.430, 331.450. (H 1021)

directors, travel expenses A/N c.243

Authorizes school board directors to receive reasonable and necessary travel expenses for all travel within or outside district or outside state. Amends sec. 129, c. 100, OL 1965. (S 321)

gifts, generally c.147 A

Authorizes school districts to accept gifts and use such gifts for purposes given. Adds to ORS chapter 332. (H 1025)

School districts (cont.)

gifts, scholarships and student loans c.132 A

Authorizes school districts to accept gifts donated to establish scholarship and loan funds for post-high school education, to control such funds and to designate committee for administration of such scholarships and loans. Adds to ORS chapter 332. (H 1116)

purchasing, bids c.123 A

Extends bid requirements in all school districts to include lease purchase agreements and rentals with options to purchase school busses. Amends ORS 332.285, 338.070. (H 1026)

purchasing, real property on contract c.130 A

Authorizes school districts to purchase real property on contract if payment period does not exceed five years. Adds to ORS chapter 332. (H 1028)

textbooks c.272 A

Authorizes school districts to provide free textbooks to students in grades 9, 10, 11 or 12 or any combination thereof. Amends ORS 337.150. Repeals ORS 337.160. (H 1127)

validation c.208 A

Validates organization, consolidation, boundaries, elections and other school district acts in so far as legislative authority exists to correct defects, irregularities and errors. (S 243)

Student loans, post-high school education c.585 A

Adds funds available for post-high school education under Health Professions Educational Assistance Act of 1963 and Nurses Training Act of 1964 to Higher Education Student Loan Fund. Continuously appropriates funds for scholarships. Makes repayment subject to applicable federal statutes. Amends ORS 351.570. Repeals ORS 351.673. Eff. 27 May 65. (H 1535)

Transfers from Superintendent of Public Instruction to Mental Health Division rule-making authority over

Area education districts, formation standards HB c.465 1104

Modifies formation criteria to need, high school enrollment, financial resources to support a community college; and material benefit to residents of area. Makes dismissal of petition by board mandatory (instead of optional) if formation of district is not warranted under policies set forth in SJR 5 (1965 Regular Session).

County school fund, Federal Forest receipts c.107 SB 307

Prohibits offset of Federal Forest receipts against county school fund levy.

District school boards, facilities and programs c.200 SB 328

Authorizes boards to contract for auxiliary services and facilities for students when costs are paid from federal funds; to provide extended educational experiences (such as work experience programs) to students through outside agencies; and to adopt courses of study in lieu of prescribed state courses with approval of Superintendent of Public Instruction.

members, conflict of interest c.350 SB 54

Modifies provisions relating to conflict of interests of members and employes of boards.

members, nomination; local school committee c.95 HB 1653

Requires signatures of 25 qualified voters on certificate of nomination for school board member in zoned districts. Requires candidates for local school committees to be nominated in same manner as member, except that only 10 signatures are required. Eff. 28 Mar. 67.

school boards' association, dues c.326 SB 308

Deletes limit on dues board may pay for membership in associations of school districts.

Education Department, educational television and radio, sale of programs c.570 SB 101

Authorizes department to sell educational television and radio programs or to exchange programs for others of similar nature.

equivalency certificates c.571 SB 102

Authorizes issuance of equivalency certificates to persons able to demonstrate educational equivalency to eighth or twelfth grade. Eff. 30 Jun. 67.

Higher Education, Board employes, payroll plan c.69 HB 1248

Permits board to use one-check payroll plan to pay its employes through bank designated by such employes.

Sea Grant College, establishment c.349 HB 1778

Establishes Sea Grant College at OSU, for education and research in marine sciences. Becomes operative only if National Science Foundation grant becomes available and Emergency Board allocates matching amount not to exceed \$500,000. Eff. 1 Jul. 67.

Intermediate education districts, boards of merged districts c.145 HB 1021

Authorizes increase in membership of intermediate education district board in merged districts. Requires members to be elected from zones. Modifies terms of office for first board of merged district if fewer than 11 members.

reorganization c.542 HB 1463

Creates committee to reorganize intermediate education districts into fewer districts by 1969. Allocates expense money from Department of Education budget. Not to exceed \$50,000 without approval of Emergency Board. Eff. 30 Jun. 67.

Permits districts to rent required space when space offered by county is inadequate. Eff. 1 Jul. 68.

Interstate Compact for Education c.606
SB 11
Enacts Interstate Compact for Education. Creates panel headed by Governor to represent state on Educational Commission of the States. Repeals compact July 1, 1969.

Law, topical revision c.67
HB 1010
Adjusts certain provisions of education laws to conform to 1965 topical revision. Eff. 17 Mar. 67.

Scholarships, grants and loans, administration c.430
SB 12
Broadens powers of State Scholarship and Assistance Commission in administering financial aid to students. Establishes Student Loan Reserve Fund to guarantee payment of loans to resident students enrolled under certain federal acts, and appropriates necessary funds for such purpose up to \$240,000. Appropriates \$38,000 to commission for administrative expenses and limits expenditures from other sources for such expenses to \$12,000. Eff. 1 Jul. 67.

_____ , student loans,
Common School Fund c.477
HB 1447
Abolishes Common School Fund Guaranty Fund. Appropriates funds not to exceed \$100,000 continuously from General Fund to guarantee reimbursement to Common School Fund for any loss caused by failure of any student to repay loan. Authorizes State Land Board to make guaranteed student loans to Oregon residents.

School districts, boundary changes, annexation c.313
HB 1403

Permits district boundary board to order annexation of an area to another school district contiguous to such area upon presentation of petition requesting such annexation signed by 100 percent of resident taxpayers and 100 percent of qualified voters of such area.

boundary boards c.328
SB 331

Eliminates requirement of concurrence of boundary boards in school district boundary changes affecting territory lying in two or more counties, unless such affected territory is under jurisdiction of different boundary boards. Eff. 26 May 67.

_____ , boundary changes,
noncontiguous territory c.298
SB 326

Prohibits school district mergers or boundary changes if territory would be noncontiguous. Eff. 19 May 67.

_____ , classification by population c.605
SB 552

Increases minimum population requirement for classification of certain school districts from 100,000 to 300,000. Permits such districts to submit question of serial levies at special elections.

_____ , validating Act c.530
SB 335

Validates school district organization, boundaries and procedures completed prior to September 13, 1967.

Special education,
disadvantaged children programs c.443
SB 380

Permits school districts with at least 50,000 average daily membership to construct special schools or additions for use in disadvantaged children programs. Provides for advances and reimbursements for such programs and construction and appropriates \$1,125,000 for such purposes. Eff. 20 Jun. 67.

Special education (cont.)

_____ , driver training courses c.296
SB 225

Authorizes school district to contract with licensed private driver training school for behind-the-wheel portion of driver instruction courses.

_____ , teacher training c.329
SB 333

Authorizes Superintendent of Public Instruction to use funds for any special educational program for preservice and in-service training of teachers in that program. Subjects position of work experience coordinator to rule-making authority of state superintendent.

Teachers, certification, qualifications, federal service c.304
HB 1011

Directs State Board of Education to grant basic teaching certificate to an otherwise qualified applicant who has completed two years of satisfactory service in certain federally sponsored programs.

_____ , dismissal c.324
SB 246

Specifies causes for dismissal of teachers not covered by tenure law.

_____ , rejection, local school committee c.315
HB 1512

Reduces authority of local school committee from power to reject teachers assigned by district school board to power to recommend rejection to board for final determination.

_____ , substitutes, salaries c.625
HB 1564

Increases minimum salaries for substitute teacher with B.A. from \$18 to \$22 per day and for teacher with M.A. from \$20 to \$24. Eff. 1 Jul. 68.

Textbooks, commission, powers; publisher fee c.370
HB 1297

Authorizes commission not to adopt textbook in particular subject field when no textbook meets criteria of commission. Requires publisher to pay fee to commission for each textbook proposed for adoption. Appropriates \$16,000 to commission for expenses. Eff. 1 Jul. 67.

Textbooks (cont.)

_____ , commission, mailing circulars to publishers c.99
HB 1296

Eliminates requirement of mailing circulars to textbook publishers when adoption of textbook becomes necessary during period between regular adoption dates.

_____ , purchase by school boards c.100
HB 1298

Permits school boards to purchase selected textbooks and materials over two-year period.

Union high school districts, elections c.103
SB 14

Provides that in a union high school election only an overall affirmative majority is required to lengthen the course of study. Requires election of local school committee by voters when district unifies.

_____ , merger and election procedures c.106
SB 217

Modifies election procedures in union high school districts. Prohibits partial lengthening of course of study if a split school district is involved. Provides for continued existence of portion of split school district lying outside boundaries of newly formed common school district, and for division of assets and liabilities between new district and split district. Eff. 3 Apr. 67.

Area education district, directors 1557 c.220

Establishes alternative methods of voting for directors in zoned area education districts, specifying application to existing districts, subject to change authorized by district voters. Requires that zones from which members are elected be as nearly equal in population as is feasible. If more than one zone is not represented on board, zone entitled to elect director shall be decided by lot. Eff. 20 May 69.

Vocational training

HB 1696

Deletes limitation on training that no other assistance or funds be available for individuals referred. Deletes listed priorities for vocational or technical training and substitutes requirement that priorities be consistent with Manpower Development and Training Act of 1962 and rules of U.S. Secretary of Labor. Eff. 20 Jun. 71.

Child-caring institutions, costs A c. 708 HB 2084

Expands responsibility of State Board of Education for approving elementary and secondary education of certain children to include children living in or under care of Christie School, Edgefield Lodge, Parry Center, St. Mary's School, Villa Gerard, Villa St. Rose and Waverly Children's Home. Makes Children's Services Division responsible for payment of cost of such education from funds appropriated therefor; establishes procedure. Appropriates \$2,500,000 from General Fund for administration and education costs of Act to Children's Services Division. Eff. 21 July 73.

Community colleges, state aid, student reimbursement, construction projects A c. 27 HB 5096

Increases state aid reimbursement rate to community colleges for students for each year of biennium. Revises distribution formula for state aid to community colleges by increasing number of students in certain categories. Appropriates \$46,165,100 from General Fund to Education Department to distribute to community colleges. Permits Emergency Board to redistribute state aid to community colleges. Permits Higher Education Board to sell designated bonds in amount equal to \$4,016,785 for Community College and Education Center Building Fund and appropriates moneys realized from sale of bonds to community college construction projects and payment of costs incident to issuance of bonds. Appropriates \$4,016,785 from General Fund to Education Department for payment of state's share of community college construction projects. Provides for distribution of proceeds from bond sale and

Community colleges, state aid, student reimbursement, construction projects (cont.)

General Fund appropriation for community college construction projects. Requires audit of construction records of each community college for period July 1965 through June 1972, to disclose eligible construction for which individual community colleges did not apply. Permits community colleges to apply for such construction and requires state to assume an unmet obligation if approved by Education Board. Increases rate of state aid reimbursement to community colleges for community college construction projects. Eff. 13 Apr. 73.

Community colleges, state aid, surplus redistribution A c. 18 HB 2480

Requires State Board of Education to redistribute certain undistributed moneys appropriated to community colleges on a pro rata basis to those community colleges over-realizing fulltime students during either year of a biennium. Includes funds appropriated during 1971-73 biennium. Eff. 28 Mar. 73.

Driver training, teachers, state reimbursement, study A c. 724 HB 2035

Requires person employed to teach course in automobile driver instruction to meet qualifications established by Superintendent of Public Instruction. Provides that each public school or facility offering course be reimbursed on basis of number of pupils completing course, including any private school pupils completing course in public school, in accordance with prescribed schedules. Revises formula for pro rata reimbursement to schools for driver education programs, effective 22 July 73. Requires Motor Vehicles Division to study effectiveness of driver education programs. Deletes requirement money unexpended in Student Driver Training Fund be transferred to State Highway Fund. Appropriates \$15,000 biennially to Motor Vehicles Division for administrative expense. Appropriates \$75,000 biennially to Superintendent of Public Instruction for expense of administration.
