with any more worthless property than I can help. I have
just finished up some papers and a letter to Capt J W
Crowford of whom I spoke in a former letter, and
mailed them. I have made some points in regard to
the last treaty with these Indians, where in they lost their
fishing rights, that have never been brought out to my
knowledge, and of anything can be done towards getting
their rights or any part of them back. I think I will now
be done. I have not much of news to write this time. A number
of the Indians have returned and several scholars are
promised next Sunday. Yes, Mrs Herriman comes over every
day and often works hard. Today she helped scrub the girls
dormitory, sitting room & your room, ^{and kitchen} and polished your stove.
I polished the cook stove. Well its about 9 o'clock so good night
