Dear Governor Atiyeh:

Thank you again for volunteering to serve on the Oregon World War II Memorial Foundation's Honorary Advisory Board--and functioning as a local ambassador to increase awareness of and promote the Memorial in your community!

Since communicating with you in May, we would like to update you on our progress on the Memorial and what our expectations are for the very near future.

- Our objective is to dedicate this Memorial on December 7, 2013, if not earlier.
- Our fundraising efforts to date have consisted mostly of reaching out to the
 veterans' community through several Veterans' Service Organizations, calling
 and /or meeting with selected individuals in the business community, and
 working with members of the State Legislature to secure some funding from
 the State of Oregon. We are pursuing a number of other avenues, to include
 community foundations, private foundations, and grass roots efforts, while
 continuing to reach out to individuals and businesses in the general
 community.
- To date we have raised \$140,000 in cash and in-kind contributions, or 11.7% of our budget, and have received a \$200,000 matching grant that is subject to us raising the balance of our \$1.2 million budget. So we currently have \$860,000 remaining to raise.
- We have proposals outstanding that could potentially amount to \$350,000 in total by January 31 of next year. These are not assured by any means, but are representative of our efforts to date.

We are continually working to cultivate new donors and create public awareness across the state. (Please visit our web site, www.oregonwwiimemorial.com, and click on "press" to see what has been accomplished to date). Also, through the generosity of a major donor, we have produced the enclosed very compelling DVD that will be used for fundraising purposes. This DVD can also be found on our web site, and we encourage you to view it to get the full impact of why we are doing what we are doing.

Our next important date will be Tuesday, February 19, 2013 at the Oregon Historical Society's Event Room from 4:00-6:30 p.m. Our hope for the event would be a kick-off with high-level potential donors as invited guests of the Honorary

The Project

Oregon is one of six states that do not have a memorial to its WWII veterans. While Oregonians have constructed memorials to honor veterans from World War I, Korea, Vietnam, the Gulf War, Iraq, Afghanistan and others, there is no memorial to those who served in World War II. The sacrifice and service of the veterans, families, and countless Oregonians who participated in the war effort during this time of global turmoil was significant and is far overdue in being recognized.

Over 150,000 Oregonians served in World War II. 3,757 of those Oregonians died fighting in that war. These brave individuals fought to protect our freedom and allow us all to live the lives we do today. There are only approximately 32,000 veterans of this war still alive today making time a critical consideration for this project.

This project will memorialize that tremendous sacrifice through the construction of a one of a kind monument that will not only honor those that gave their lives, but will also have a significant ongoing educational component. By using current technology and QR codes embedded in the base of the Memorial, future generations can learn from and be inspired by, the experiences and sacrifices of our "Greatest Generation".

The Design

Oregon's World War II Memorial will feature a 5-sided granite obelisk standing 33' high. This design is unique to this Memorial. The Memorial will be built with granite quarried in the USA and will cover a space of 75x75 feet. The Memorial will be constructed in Wilson Park, located on the state Capitol grounds.

Budget

The budget for this project is \$1.1 million. There has been over \$100,000 in in-kind donations contributed to the project to date and countless volunteer hours given by Board members, contractors and others to help bring this project to fruition. Every effort has been made to keep costs reasonable and all administrative costs low.

Timeline

For the project, the construction of the Memorial would follow the tentative timeline:

- Phase 1: Purchase and delivery of obelisk, granite walls, related materials
- Phase 2: Purchase of benches, service emblems, pavers, story board, lights, engraving and related costs

- Phase 3: Obtaining construction permits. Deposits on electrical work. Development and related expenses for the site
- Phase 4: Site work & electrical
- Phase 5: Construction and placement of memorial, development and related site expenses
- · Phase 6: Final landscaping, planning of dedication, open to the public

The Board of Directors for the World War II Memorial Foundation is currently working to implement fundraising for the establishment of this memorial.
