NO ONE knows where Boxer the statue is, but a large oil painting of the missing Pacific University mascot was given to the university recently by an anonymous donor and is now in the school's alumni office.

It was painted by Wanda Williams of the class of 1968 and has been owned by different students living off campus.

Boxer is a 400-year-old Chinese idol given to the university in 1896. Through the years it has represented university spirit and, thus, has been coveted by many campus groups.

The statue, however, has been missing from campus since 1969.
