
# Migrant Camps in Washington County



The purpose of this Directory is to provide the most current information available on migrant camps in Washington County. It is an effort to coordinate and increase food distribution and volunteer participation among church and community groups who serve farmworkers.

Information for this Directory was gathered by volunteers and groups who visit the camps, and was then organized by workers from Community Action Organization, Oregon Food Bank Linkage Program, and the PACTO Program of Centro Cultural.

Labor camps in Washington County are constantly changing. There are seasonal and yearly changes in availability of employment and housing as well as crops picked. Washington County is experiencing a decrease in the number of migrant camps and a trend toward less acreage for crops, impacting employment for seasonal farmworkers.

It is difficult to accurately count the numbers of workers in each camp, so camp supporters providing food and other services are encouraged to keep records which can be of value to updates of this Directory.

## How to use this guide:

The 27 Camps are grouped according to geography and divided into three sections.

Group 1 (Camps 1 through 8) is the Cornelius-Gaston Group.

Group 11 (Camps 9 through 17) is the Hillsboro-Scholls Group.

Group 111 (Camps 18 through 27) is the North Plains-Banks Group.

There are maps numbered with the camp designated number included with each section. Each camp has a description of characteristics and directions. Be advised that some camps have rules posted regarding visitors and/or check-in at camp entrance.



## GROUP NUMBER ONE: CORNELIUS/ GASTON

Seasonal housing for men and 4-5 families.

Expected peak capacity: 60-70 people

Type of housing: three cabins and one shed.

Crops harvested: strawberries.

**Directions:** Travel south from Forest Grove on Hwy. 47; take the Stringtown Road exit, and look for the address on the left hand side of the road about two miles from Hwy 47.




Expected peak capacity: 48 people.

Type of housing: six cabins.

Crops harvested: strawberries and blueberries

**Directions:** Travel south of Cornelius on 10th Street; turn right on Lafollette Road after crossing the first bridge; follow the road around the first left turn and ee the cabins on the left side one-half mile from the oad's left turn.

Year-round housing for men as well as two families.


Expected peak capacity: 55-60 people.

**Directions:** Travel south from Cornelius on 10th Street, which becomes Golf Course Road; the farm is about 1 1/2 miles south of Cornelius' Echo Shaw Elementary School, on the right.

Year-round housing for men and families.


Expected peak capacity: 80 people.

**Directions:** Travel south of Cornelius on 10th Street, which becomes Golf Coruse Road; the farm is about 1 1/2 miles south of Cornelius' Echo Shaw Elementary School, past the Lutheran church.


Expected peak capacity: 100 people.

**Directions:** travel south of Cornelius on 10th Street, which becomes Golf Course Road; at the golf course, turn right and continue until reaching the cemetery; turn right on Nursery Road and look for the camp on the right side of the road.


Housing for men and a few families.

Expected peak capacity: 120 people. Camp is open spring - summer.

Type of housing: three trailers and 22 cabins.

Crops harvested: strawberries, raspberries, blackberries, marionberries and cucumbers.

*Directions*: Travel South from Cornelius on 10th Street/Golf Course Road. Just after the Lutheran Church, turn right on Blooming-Fernhill Road. Travel about 1 1/2 miles to Winters Road and turn left. Travel on Winters Road until you see the camp on your left side.


Housing for men and families.

*Directions*: Travel south from Forest Grove to Gaston; turn east in Gaston on Gaston Road, following Springhill Road to the right another two miles; look on the right side of the road for a sign.




Expected peak capacity: 20-30 people.



*Directions*: Travel south from Hillsboro on First Street (Hwy. 219); go past Hwy 10 (Farmington Road) one mile and turn right on a gravel road. The camp is about one-half mile ahead.


Seasonal housing for men and families.

*Directions*: Travel south from Hillsboro on First Street (Hwy. 219); at Hwy 10 (Farmington Road) turn left and find the entrance to Heikes Drive about one mile ahead on the right side.

Type of housing: 12 trailers, six cabins and three houses.


Crops harvested: strawberries, raspberries, cucumbers and blackberries.
