This convention is to be held in the Syrian capital, Damascus, as from the 25th of October 1985 to the 30th of October, under the auspices of the President of the Syrian Arab Republic, His Excellency Hafez Al-Assad. The general theme of the Convention shall be to discuss ways and means to strengthen the relations between the Arab Nation and the peoples of the American continent.

Distinguished personalities beside congressmen and members of Parliament such as governors, heads of Arab-American organizations, lawyers, writers and professors of Arab roots and some of their American friends shall attend as observers.

Among the main items to be examined at the Convention is how to promote the ties that bind the Syrian Parliament to the legislatures in the Americas, and how to strengthen the economic and cultural relations between Syria and the bulk of the countries of the American continents, paying a special attention to the consolidation of the links between the Community of Arab descent and the original motherland, and exploring the possibilities of establishing mixed American-Syrian parliamentary committees of friendship.
