POSTMASTER GENERAL OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, On the 29th day of April 1886, Cyrus H. Walker was appointed Postmaster at Farm Springs, in the County of Brook, State of Oregon, and whereas he did, on the 15th day of May, 1886, execute Bond, and has taken the Oath of Office, as required by law:

Now know ye, That confiding in the integrity, ability, and punctuality of the said Cyrus H. Walker I do commission him a Postmaster, authorized to execute the duties of that Office at Farm Springs aforesaid, according to the Laws of the United States and the Regulations of the Post Office Department: To hold the said Office of Postmaster, with all the powers, privileges, and emoluments to the same belonging, during the pleasure of the Postmaster General of the United States.

In testimony whereof I have hereto set my hand, and caused the seal of the Post Office Department to be affixed, at Washington City, this twenty-ninth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and tenth.

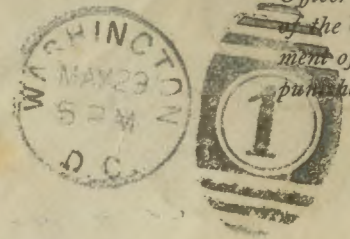
