

Had come by sea in first place,
Then he went to Washington - was
appointed Indian agent and
in 1842 escorted "quit" party -
perhaps 100 to Oregon by trail.

Mrs Victor says he was so
happy-go-lucky he felt
capable - tho had never been
over the road - made mistake
by having party leave all wagons
at Ft. Larimer and Ft. Hall.

Have been trying to find
something that would state
about ~~how~~ size of Oregon
city around 1843. Must
have been a number of people
there you know that on May 3
1843 the provisional government
meeting was held at Champoug.
Men were there from all over the
valley. Chief among them was
"Jest-meek", The Painter's grandfather
Moore was there, also John W. Smith's
father - "blubber-mouth Smith".

Mr. ^{J.S.} Griffin organized Cong
church - just east of Hillsboro
1842, Clark Forest grove 1845,
Clark - Oregon City (Willamette Falls) 1844.
but the members voted to have it Pres-
byterian. The log house at F. G.
was the first ^{congr} church building
in Willamette valley - The others held
meeting in their homes at first.

an early place opposite
Oregon City was Robert's Nest
a settlement not a church.

Even might know
dates for Naylor and Stokes -
If he once heard them he
would remember.

About the Naylor cemetery
after he gave the 4 acres it was found
that 2 acres of it were on the Buxton
tract, so Naylor paid the old lady
Buxton and in 1861 she signed
deed to the church. This was "Gramma"
Buxton - step-mother of Henry.

There is neither beginning nor
end to these notes - and not much in
the middle.

#5 - you know Maama bonded
at Taylors - that was the first
Mrs Taylor - she had 4 children.
(Mrs Gleason was one) after her
death he married his niece,
"Bill" catching place must
be just east of Stokes, Ben
Catching place down the hill
east of Buxton Cemetery, They
were early - don't know their year.

Not sure whether the 1843 or
were the first to bring over - but
they were first to bring wagons
to Columbia river, 42 or left
wagons at Jett's farm & Boial but
from wagons made few 2 wheel
carts - brought them to Whitman's
