The Oregon Constitution (Article IV, Sec. 8) requires only that anyone elected to the Oregon Legislature must be a U. S. citizen, 21 years of age and a one-year resident of the county or district in which he or she seeks office.

- 3. Educational background
- 4. Occupational background
- 5. Previous government experience
- 6. A personal statement
