
PACIFIC UNIVERSITY



Pacific University is an independent privately endowed co-educational school, having an enrollment of approximately 700 students. It is located in the beautiful Tualatin Valley just 20 miles west of Portland in the city of Forest Grove where it was founded over 100 years ago. Although interdenominational in nature it is affiliated with and endorsed by the Congregational Christian Churches of the United Church of Christ.

All students at Pacific University are provided with a strong liberal arts program which is emphasized during the first two years, thus assuring the student of a broad educational background in addition to a major field of study. The entire University is dedicated to the understanding and appreciation of the world about us as well as the preparation of young men and women for a useful role in society.

There are four major divisions on the campus: The College of Liberal Arts, The School of Music, The College of Optometry and the Graduate School.



YOUR HIGH SCHOOL BACKGROUND

The following program of high school studies is recommended for students seeking admission to Pacific University:

English	4 years
Mathematics (Other than general	2 years math.)
Science (Lab.)	2 years
Foreign Language	1 year
Social Studies	3 years

In addition Pacific is interested in students with well-rounded but not over-loaded extracurricular programs. All applicants are required to take the College Board Examination and forward the results to Pacific University. This may be done through consultation with your counselor or senior adviser.

In addition to this, admission to Pacific University is based upon:

- 1. A satisfactory high school academic record.
- 2. Character, attitude and apparent adaptability to the college program of studies.
- 3. Ability to experience an adequate social adjustment.
- 4. Personal references.
- 5. Personal interview.


They Come From Everywhere

Candidates for admission to Pacific University are selected on the basis of predictions as to promise (1) as a student, and (2) as a person. When candidates appear to be well matched in these two respects preference will be given to those who live in regions not already well represented in the class. At present, students enrolled at Pacific come from 38 states and 15 foreign countries (Brazil, Canada, Denmark, England, Formosa, Iran, Japan, Korea, Nigeria, Okinawa, Pakistan, Philippines, Spain, Trinidad).

OREGON is famed as a year-round outdoor play-ground. Recreation facilities exist along the magnificent coast line, in the vast mountain ranges and on the high plateaus. World renowned Crater Lake, snow-capped Mount Hood, Oregon Caves and Wallowa Lake rank among the best scenic attractions.








FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Pacific University has approximately \$50,-000 available in scholarship funds in addition to a large number of opportunities for campus employment. Students who graduate in the top 10% of their class may receive Scholarship with Honors at Entrance. Others who fulfill general admission requirements may receive assistance through grants-in-aid. Awards are based principally upon need. All students having need are also eligible for campus employment.





STUDENT ACTIVITIES

There are many opportunities for the student who is inclined toward participation in student government. Pacific students have an active student body organization which is encouraged by faculty and administrators and considered an important part of the university program. Within this framework are found opportunities for work in fraternal organizations, sororities, academic and social functions, intercollegiate and intramural athletics. These activities at Pacific are considered important from the standpoint of both their recreational and constructive values.

CLASSES ARE SMALL

An intimate campus and a friendly faculty means there are no "forgotten students". The limited size of the student body makes for greater opportunity for self expression and development of the individual. Students and professors become well acquainted and those students who take advantage of this find a very personal and practical learning experience in the classroom.
