- Coordinated summer food distribution system with representatives from Oregon Food Bank, Centro Cultural, Virginia Garcia Clinic, OHDC, and churches at June meeting held at CAO.
- Facilitated small group process for "Dialogue on Poverty" session held at Centro Cultural.
- Distributed 2000 Info & Referral cards "Where to Call for Help in Washington County" listing available resources for farmworkers and families, including to the following agencies:.
- CAO and Homeless Shelter; DVRC; State of Or. Employment Department in Hillsboro and Beaverton; Virginia Garcia Clinic; Oregon Legal Services; Centro Cultural; Dept. of Aging Services; Migrant Head Start; Or. Human Development Corp; Portland Community College Job Training and ESL/Adult Literacy programs; La Casa del Futuro; Adult and Family Services and Food Stamps in Hillsboro and Migrant Outreach station; Or. Food Bank; St. Vincent de Paul of Aloha and Hillsboro; 8 Churches who sponsor migrant camps; and Martha Dahenhauer who volunteers in 27 camps.
- Represented PACTO at Centro Cultural Annual meeting, and collected historical info. re: farmworkers in Washington County for the 24th Anniversary of Centro.
- Provided medical translation services for farmworker injured in car accident
- Wrote and translated for, and helped distribute *F.G. News-Times* issue in Spanish, consumer education and other resource related info. This monthly edition reaches 9,000 readers.
- Attended Forest Grove High School graduation at invitation of farmworker families.
- Assisted migrant and year-around farmworkers to obtain food, clothing, household supplies, furniture, educational services, etc. through info and referral and linking to El Fondo, Emergency Fund.
- After the fire in Aloha apartments, contacted relatives of those affected re: needs, church donations, and other referrals and later visited the site on Sunday.
