THEY ARE OLDEST LIVING **BORN WEST OF ROCKIES** 

Both Were Children of Missionaries to Indians of Old Oregon Territory.

Eliza Spalding Warren and Cyrus Hamlin Walker, the two oldest living children born west of the Rocky Mountains, met Friday at the Fourth of July celebration at Ash Swale, Linn county. Mrs. Warren was born at Spalding's Mission at Lapwai, Idaho, November 15, 1837 and Walker was born at the Whitman Mission, near the present site of Walla Walla, Washington, and scene of the famous Whitman massacre, December 7, 1838. The parents of both were missionaries to the Indians.

Mrs. Warren is now visiting friends and relatives in Brownsville and went to the celebration from that city. She

resided until about a year ago at Chellan, Washington, but is now making her home near Prineville. She visited recently in Eugene. Walker has resided for me the state of the

The meeting of the two oldest native white children of the old Oregon territory attracted great attention at the celebraion. Walker sang an Indian jargon song and gave a talk on "Occara" diving the "Oregon Reminiscences," during the

program of the day.
