Portlander Sam Kahl has never been to Egypt, but this morning in Cario the cousin of Governor Atiyeh is making a dream come true.

Sam Kahl left Syria and the middle east of 1949 but from his Oregon vantage point he followed the career of Egypt's president Abdul Gammel Nasser.

After nearly 400 years of Turkish occupation, and maybe 100 years or more of French and English rule in the middle east.

Nasser came to power and restore the dignity and self-respect of the average man, Egypt and the Arab as a whole.

Millions mourned Nasser's passing in 1970 and now fourteen years later Sam Kahl lays a wreath at Nasser's tomb.

Back in the United States, Nasser is remembered mostly as the architect of Arab Unity in this part of the world and also something too, is something of a hard liner when seen through the eyes of American Self-interest.

But here in Cairo, he is considered a hero. A And a hero as well to Portlander Sammy Kahl.
