Re: Retrocession Day brief

Retrocession Day (or Restoration Day), Oct. 25, 1945, was the date on which the Japanese, as part of their World War II surrender terms, ended 50 years of occupation of Formosa by returning it to Chinese control.

It was a quiet day, virtually unnoticed by anyone outside of Formosa or China and unrecorded in the New York Times and the Oregonian. According to Prof. Joe Esherik of the University of Oregon history department, the usual state formalities accompanying such occasions were taken care of quietly. Japanese Gen. Ando (On'do) handed over the Formosan seal and flag to representatives of the Chinese Kuomintang (Kwo'mean-dong) government based in Nanking.

Although it is a day of independence for the Taiwanese, it is not the joyous occasion for some there that the Fourth of July spirit is here. Prior to Retrocession Day, some Formosan officials had moved to Nanking and worked with mainland officials there for some time to insure that, when Formosa was delivered from Japan, those Formosans would hold places of importance in the new government. The Formosans transplanted to Nanking became miffed when they were not included or even noticed much in the official business of surrendering. The mainland Nanking officials went to Taipei to accept the symbols of surrender themselves. The Taiwanese independence-movement feeling had started many years before with a turning point in anti-mainland feeling not coming until 1947 with the February 27 Incident (a taboo subject today), so the ignoring of the Formosan officials was not a key factor of the movement. It was, rather, one more irritation in a long chain of events. The Republic of China and the People's Republic of China remain separate yet connected, and so the mixed feelings of Retrocession Day continue to be significant to some Taiwanese.

The decision to return Formosa to China was made at the Cairo Conference in November 1943 by presidents Roosevelt and Chiang, and Prime Minister Churchill. The Cairo Declaration stated, "It is their (the Allies') purpose that Japan shall be stripped of all the islands in the Pacific which she had seized or occupied since the beginning of the first World War in 1914, and that all the territories Japan has stolen from the Chinese, such as Manchuria, Formosa and the Pescadores, shall be restored to the Republic of China. Japan will also be expelled from all other territories which she has taken by violence and greed."

HEALTH INFORMATION

In order to make your stay in Cairo as enjoyable as possible, the Health Unit wishes to pass along a few health tips:

1. Drink only boiled or bottled water. This includes ice cubes. Alcohol does not purify any liquid.
2. Do not eat the local lettuce or dairy products. Fruits that can be peeled and vegetables that are well cooked may be eaten.
3. All foods should be eaten HOT or COLD. Bacteria love lukewarm food.
4. All Meat is to be eaten well-done.
5. Do not eat food sold at side walk vendors.
6. Local sea food should be well cooked.
7. Drink copious amounts of liquids during the hot weather, wear a hat and do not over expose yourself to the sun.
8. Report any diarrhea that lasts longer than 24 hours. The best first aid treatment for diarrhea is Pepto Bismal: 1 tablespoon every hour for 8 hours. And replacement of fluids lost by drinking bottle water, sodas or juices.
9. Be careful when crossing streets. Cars and trucks always have the right of way and use it.

Cairo is a marvelous and exciting city, so stay healthy and have fun.

CAIRO SIGHTS - REMNANTS OF ANCIENT HISTORY TO BE SEEN
IN AND AROUND CAIRO

THE PYRAMIDS OF GIZA AND THE SPHINX

One of "the seven wonders of the world", the massive pyramid of Pharaoh Khufu (Cheops) may be entered from the north side to view the galleries and funeral chambers. Except a rather steep climb up a ramp with low overhead. You will not find a great deal of visual attraction, but you will better appreciate the awe-inspiring dimensions of the structure, and the effort will be well worthwhile for those who would not consider a trip to Cairo without visiting the tomb of Cheops. The Sphinx, marked by Napoleon's cannon, but sitting as serenely and as proudly as ever, lies just to the east of the major pyramid.

THE STEP PYRAMID OF SAKKARA

You will drive through an agricultural belt to the final resting place of King Zoser, Third Dynasty. Nearby lie the ruins of Memphis, the white-walled capital of the Old Kingdom. At Sakkara, you may visit the Serapeum, an underground gallery where the Pharaohs buried the sacred bulls.

THE EGYPTIAN MUSEUM

Centrally located, just behind the Nile Hilton Hotel, the Egyptian Museum houses the richest and most interesting collection of Egyptian antiquities. It contains Pharaonic treasures dating back more than 5000 years, and artifacts from past-Pharaonic periods.

OTHER MUSEUMS

The Coptic Museum contains a rare collection of objects from Egypt's Christian Era. The Islamic Art Museum displays one of the world's largest collections of Islamic masterpieces.

THE CITADEL

This massive structure which dominates Cairo from the east was built by Salah El Din (Saladin) in 1183 A.D. on the foundations of an older structure. The grounds contain several important monuments, including the College Medina.

CAIRO MOSQUES - A FEW OF THE MORE NOTABLE
IN "THE CITY OF A THOUSAND MINARETS"

MOSQUE OF IBN TULUN: Built in 876 A.D., it is the oldest mosque in Cairo, The Ibn Tulun mosque is noted for its simplicity and its grandeur.

SULTAN HASSAN MOSQUE: Built in 1343, is considered one of the greatest Islamic monuments in Cairo.

AL AZHAR MOSQUE: Was founded in the year 970 and contains the oldest university in the world. It is still deemed to be the foremost center of theology in Islam.

AL HUSSEIN MOSQUE: Was built in honor of the grandchild of the Prophet Mohamed. The mosque houses some of the most sacred relics of Islam, including pieces of the Prophet's clothing and other articles used by the Prophet. The Al Hussein Mosque is not open to non-Moslems, except by special permission.

OTHER POINTS OF INTEREST IN CAIRO

OLD CAIRO: Contains several early Coptic churches as well as an ancient synagogue amid its narrow, twisting streets.

KHAN EL KHALILI BAZAAR: Is located near the Al Hussein Mosque. In a mode of operation little changed over the centuries, shop owners offer to sell worked gold, silver, precious stones, metalware, leathergoods and other typical mideast wares.

THE TOWER OF CAIRO: Is the most recent landmark in the city. The tower looms 180 meters above Gezira Island and commands one of the best panoramic views.
