WASHINGTON COUNTY, OREGON

How long can you keep a place with clean air, clear lakes, a lively sense of history and some of the loveliest scenery this side of the Rockies a deep dark secret?

About 135 years. Give or take a decade. But the word is out, and Washington County is telling the world what's behind that well-publicized silicon forest just minutes from downtown Portland and only 85 miles from the Oregon coast.

A land of rolling hills and mellow farmlands where vineyards and wineries are popping up every day like corks. In a landscape dotted with historic homes many still occupied by descendants of the original owners who built them in the late nineteenth century. Where you can visit some of the most picturesque country church sites in rural America. Old Scotch Church near Hillsboro is the most photographed building in the county and Joe Meek himself, mountain man, provisional legislator and first U.S. Marshall of the Oregon Territory lies in its churchyard, a mecca for tombstone-rubbing enthusiasts.

The diversity of things to see and do could fill many more day trips than the five we've outlined here. Visit an authentic blacksmith shop, untouched since its last smith left it in 1964. Take

a ride in Trolley Park where the venerable relics go to be restored and ridden once again. Go boating on Hagg Lake. Play golf or tennis. Rent a horse. Even fly over Mt. St. Helens from Hillsboro Airport. And of course, there's almost always something going on so we've included a calendar of events to keep you busy year-round.

If you can eat it, you'll find it in Washington County. You're never too far from French, Thai, Szechwan or Italian cooking in one of Washington County's cities and towns. And along its byways, you'll want to stop for what must be the world's largest hamburger at the historic Helvetia Tavern. Or dine out in nineteenth century style at the Imbrie Farmstead where you can combine an historic tour of the 19th Century Italianate Villa (and one of the world's last octagonal barns) with delicious country-style cooking.

Save a day for Washington County. If you're visiting Portland, you'll want to plan on taking at least one of the day trips we've outlined for you here. If you live nearby, there's discovery waiting around every colorful bend

along our billboard-free country roads. So save this booklet with its handy map and guides. And make your first trip right away. After 135 years, we have so much saved up to show you.

TOUR #1 Fine Wines, Great Wineries

Washington County's climate is similar to the great wine growing regions of southern France. In fact, most of the famous Oregon wines that have been attracting international attention were born right here in Washington County. All wineries offer group tours by appointment, and most have picnic facilities. Forthwith, a tour of five that'll give you a taste for many more. It is recommended that a short nap be included in your plans at this tour's conclusion.

Ponzi Vineyards. Take Sunset Hwy (26) west to Hwy 217, south to Scholls Ferry Rd. (210) exit, west on 210 to Vandermost Rd., then follow signs. An intimate, family operation producing award winning dry table wines of Pinot Noir, Chardonnay, Riesling and Pinot Gris. A blended wine, Oregon Harvest is also produced each year. Tasting and sales, weekends 12-5. (503) 628-1227

Mulhausen Vineyards. Leaving Ponzi, turn left on Scholls Ferry Rd. (210). Continue to where Scholls Ferry Rd. turns into River Rd. and turn left at this Scholls intersection, and continue on past town of Scholls to Jacquith Rd. and turn right. A family operation established in 1973 by Zane and Pat Mulhausen with a planting of Chardonnay, White Riesling and Pinot Noir. The vineyard totals 30 acres and another 30 are planned. Picnic facilities with a spectacular view of four mountains and surrounding countryside are available. Tasting 12-5 weekends. (503) 628-2417

Oak Knoll Winery. Leaving Mulhausen, take a left on Scholls Ferry to left on River Rd., then left on Farm-
